UC DAVIS: Basic Skills Guidance

The Basic Skills Requirement is made up of three content areas: Reading, Writing, and Mathematics. Recent changes now allow you to mix and match the options you may use to meet this requirement. You can combine the options of passing test(s) and passing course(s) until you met an option for each content area. To determine if you have met this requirement already, please follow these steps:

- 1. Review each content area listed on the mix and match option chart to see if you have already completed the requirement. If after reviewing the tests already taken section you have not yet met all content areas, you will next explore if you have passed course(s) in the content area:
 - a. **UC Davis undergraduates:** Review our <u>Course Equivalency website</u> to see if you took any courses as a UC Davis undergraduate that will meet a content area. You had to earn a grade of B- or higher (Pass/Credit works if letter grade not offered) and need a total of 4.0 quarter units in each content area.
 - b. **If you transferred Community College coursework to UC Davis:** Review our <u>Course</u> <u>Equivalency website</u> to see if any of your courses are listed. If they are not, follow the steps listed below in C-ii.
 - c. **Undergraduate not from UC Davis**: If you believe you passed a course that covers the required content:
 - Reach out to the Teacher Education program where you completed the course and ask them to email verification that the course meets the CTC requirements to <u>credentialanalyst@ucdavis.edu</u>. If you need assistance or guidance on this, please email us at that email address.
 - ii. If there is no Teacher Education program at your college please submit a course inquiry on our Course Equivalency website, providing the course description and syllabus of the course you believe meets the content area. Our faculty will review your request and we'll get back to you in about two weeks.
- 2. If after reviewing the options for tests and/or courses you have already taken, you have not met an option from each content area, take the CBEST exam covering the unmet content area(s). Please review our <u>website</u> for information on recommended timing to schedule your exam.
- 3. Complete our <u>Basic Skills Summary</u> to indicate how you have met/will meet this requirement. You will receive an email from <u>eduadvising@ucdavis.edu</u> summarizing your submission. Hold on to this email until you are ready to submit your application for admission.
- 4. After submitting your application for admission, Graduate Studies will email you directions to upload required documentation. Please PDF the Basic Skills Summary email (from step 3) along with test results you are using to meet this requirement and upload as your Basic Skills.
